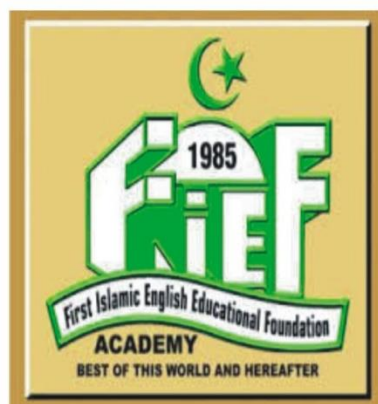

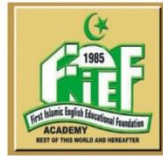

RETROSPECT GENESIS OF THE DAY OF AFRICAN CHILD

The day of African child was celebrated on 16th June, every year to commemorate the 'Soweto uprising' in South Africa during the apartheid era. But do we really know why?

CAUSES OF THE UPRISING

In 1974 a law was passed in South Africa known as AFRIKAANS MEDIUM DECREE OF 1974, which forced all black schools to use Afrikaans and English as languages of instructions.

On January 1, 1975, Afrikaans became the medium of instruction in mathematics, arithmetic and social studies from standard five (7th grades), while English is meant for general science and practical subjects.

The decree was to reduce English which had gained prominence as the language of commerce and industries. This decree was widely resisted and deeply rejected by blacks as: Afrikaans was viewed as the language of the "oppressor. It was therefore, rejected by the black students and African teachers association of South Africa.

On June 16th June 1976 thousands of black students walk from their schools to Orlando stadium in Soweto to protest the African's decree. The protest was peaceful and careful and planned by the Soweto students' representative council led by Tsietse Mashinini. The police shot into the peaceful procession and disorganized them. The violence started and over 200 people were killed on the 16th June, 1976 including Dr. Melville Edelstein, a committed social welfare worker among blacks.

On June 17, 1976 the white Government deployed over 1,500 heavily armed police officers to Soweto to mow down the black students protesters. The armoured and artilleries laid siege to Soweto town by shooting and killing innocent black youth in their prime.

The casualty figure was reported from 200-500 black students killed in the uprising. This marked the turning point in the liberation struggle championed by the African national congress (ANC). Fathers, mothers, sisters and other guests, this is the reason for our celebration in painful memories of the black children massacred in Soweto in 1976. It is not a jamboree rather, a sober reflection on the plight of the African child especially the Muslim children who are equally marginalized because of their faith.

Our dear guest this is the essence of today and what FIEF stood for, by yearly bringing to memories the sad event of 1976. We hope to make a change in the lives of the Muslim children who will eventually become the leaders of Muslim Ummah tomorrow.

Thank you and have a fulfill celebration.

In 1984, concerned about the state of the world and its influence on youth, Sheikh Muhammad Al-Mansur Williams had a vision to effect change in the lives of these impressionable young people.

With faith in the leading of Allah, he took it upon himself to begin a school, whose purpose was to provide spiritual guidance in an academic environment, giving students the opportunity to reach their potentials within the walls of a school promoting the three aspects of obedience to God through moral values and behavior, educational excellence, and physical development.

By 1985 Sheikh Muhammad Williams had overcome daunting opposition and FIEF Academy had become a reality, the oldest continually-operating private school in Nigeria. In the intervening years it has proven itself a success as children from throughout the world have come to learn under the skilled teaching of dedicated teachers and other staff. Others have recognized its excellence, as noted by various awards, one of which is the 2008 and 2009 National Quality School Award given by the Quality Management Development Institute, Lagos, an annual honor given to those in the field of education who have demonstrated excellence.

At FIEF Academy, students from Pre-School through High School are taught with attention to the whole person: their mental, spiritual, social, and physical well-being. In a world of violence, moral corruption, political upheaval, and increasing lack of personal responsibility, the goal is to help these children develop into morally upright, educated adults, improving society as they become a contributing part of it. It has been-and continues to be-our goal to help our students by not only the teaching of academics but also by providing a moral compass through spiritual instruction.

The success is reflected on the faces of students engaged in the learning process: whether their eyes are closed as they prayerfully worship, their brows are furled as they concentrate on their studies, or their mouths upturned in smiles or laughter as they joyously participate in get-togethers such as sports. There is no greater satisfaction for our staff than to see learning on all levels. This dedication to the



whole person can result in a graduate who possesses the knowledge and character that allows them opportunities to have a voice not only in his/her own future but in the world's.

And now the dream continues. Sheikh Mohammed Al-Mansur Williams could rest on the realization of his long-ago vision, but he has chosen not to. FIEF Academy has prepared students for the future, which in many cases means post-secondary studies, and he sees that as a natural extension of his passion for building lives through “moral training alongside academic” learning. He wants young people to continue their studies with this same emphasis and is now ready to provide equal excellence in education on a university level. Sheikh Muhammad Williams' first endeavor is an online university project, with a projected physical campus to complement it, in five to ten years.

Through online learning, FIEF will provide global education in English, allowing students the flexibility to take courses at the convenience of their own schedules and locations; a computer and the internet are the only requirements. FIEF will also provide two options for courses: self-improvement and credit. The first allows a student to learn without the pressure of grades, testing, or other required work; it permits one to learn without external pressures. The second will give college credit for completed course work. Online courses, also known as e-learning, as well as online universities, are the wave of the future, and FIEF is excited to be part of this next generation of instruction. As it prepares for its initial semester, opportunities are available for professors with a desire to teach at the school, opportunities to have a voice not only in the futures of your students, but in the world's future.

Another opportunity presents itself in the need for investors who are interested in a financial relationship. FIEF is in the vanguard of an exciting entre into the collegiate experience and offers partnerships with those interested in investing in the future of not only young people in Africa, but world-wide. It is a stake in the future: educating future business, political, and societal leaders who, with a strong moral compass, can influence the world.

It is an opportunity to provide an avenue for future leaders to continue the dream of a world filled with hope, peace, and personal fulfillment, an opportunity to leave the world a better place in the future. Our vision is to allow young people the idea of a world in which they can dream—and a world in which dreams can be realized. Are you willing to be part of our dream—and theirs?

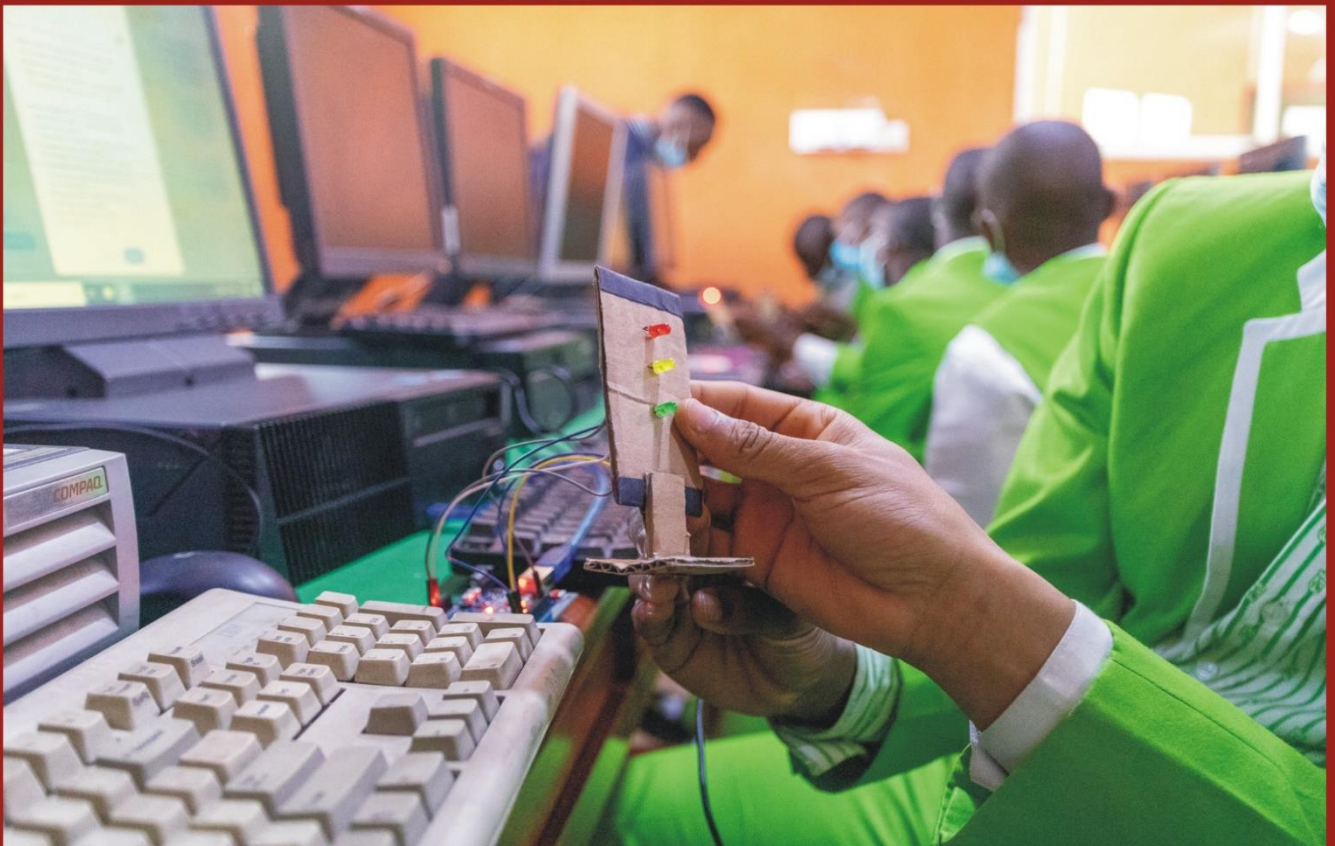

Seminar & Practical Experience on Fire Fighting

FEDERAL FIRE SERVICE DURING SENSITIZATION EXERCISE AT FIEF ACADEMY ON 13TH JULY, 2021.

Hmmm... FIEF again in her resolute determination for all encompassing education is witnessing another milestone in equipping the staff and students on hazard management. Looking at the negative impacts of fire incidents on lives and properties across the globe, it then becomes imperative for the members of public to be well sensitized about it. Hence, the school has taken another bolder step in inviting the men of the Federal Fire Service for sensitization exercise.

The exercise commenced exactly 10:45AM. The Founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of FIEF Academy, His Eminence, the (Crowned Prince of {Eko}) Lagos, Sheikh Mansur Al-Mansur Akinola Williams warmly welcomed the representatives of the Federal Fire Service, Mr. Fredinard and Mr. U.N. Undie to the school via singing of the National Anthem.

Mr. Fredinard started the exercise by appreciating the management for the privilege to educate the School on the causes and prevention of fire outbreak in our society. He then defined "fire as rapid combination of two or more elements, or substances in equal proportion that result in the production of heat and light. He further identified three elements that must be present in equal proportion before fire could occur. In his words, these substances are *"fuel, heat and oxygen."*

The fuel is defined as anything that can burn and are classified into three(3) which include: ***Solid Fuel*** (paper, wood, plastic, etc.), ***Gaseous fuel*** (gas) and ***Liquid fuel*** (diesel, kerosene, candle wax, Premium Motor Spirit (petrol), **The Heat** on the other hand is referred to as the maximum temperature that support ignition, while **Oxygen** is said to be the supporter of combustion. Fire cannot survive without oxygen.





CAUSES OF FIRE OUTBREAK

- * **CARELESSNESS:** This is the act of not paying attention or doing things right.
- * **WILLFUL ACT OR ARSON:** It is the deliberate act of setting fire on something as a result of violent political activities, riot or wicked/jealous competitors.
- * **ACCIDENT:** It is caused by natural occurrence such as thunder strike, earthquake, landslide, volcanic eruption, etc.

Having stated the causes of fire outbreak, Mr Frednard listed the **EFFECTS OF FIRE** which include: *Loss of lives, Loss of properties, Loss of vital documents, Injuries, High cost of renovation, Destruction and Disruption of businesses.* He also listed further some **HAZARDS OF FIRE** which are *Smoke increase, High temperature and Toxic atmosphere.*



TOXIC ATMOSPHERE

CLASSIFICATIONS OF FIRE

- » **CLASS "A" FIRE:** This class involves free burning materials (solid fuel) such as wood, paper, etc. Its extinguishing agent is *water*.
- » **CLASS "B" FIRE:** It involves flammable liquids such as coal tar, fat, oil, kerosene, diesel, premium motor spirit (petrol), etc. Its extinguishing agents are *fire blanket, chemicals powder (fire extinguisher), Ammonium dihydrogen phosphate* (monoammonium phosphate), etc.
- » **CLASS "C" FIRE:** It involves liquefied gases. Its extinguishing agent is **CO2 extinguisher** which contains one molecule carbon and two molecules of oxygen
- » **CLASS "D" FIRE:** This class involves metals such as iron, coal, potassium, zinc, etc. Its extinguishing agent is dry chemical powder.

FIRE EXTINGUISHING METHODS

Methods of extinguishing fire according to Mr Frednard of the Nigeria Fire Service, include *Cooling method (Removal of Heat), Smoldering method (Removal of Fuel).*

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

- Remove or clear any form of obstruction from your way out;
- Know who to call;
- Contact nearby fire department on their direct line;
- Participate in all fire emergency drills;
- If there is fire outbreak go to the scene of the fire with any fire extinguisher;
- Report fire emergency properly and promptly;
- Do not ignore fire, smell or smoke;
- Raise alarm; and
- Above all, take responsibility in ensuring safety precautions at all times.





GENERAL FIRE PRECAUTIONS

- If there is fire outbreak and smoke has covered everywhere, then bend down because there is always visibility and oxygen at the bottom of the smoke.
- Walk-on your knees and on the back of your palms in order to avoid being electrocuted in case of naked wire on the floor.
- Proper housekeeping and keeping obstructing materials from the doors.
- Regular checking of electrical appliances.
- Adherence to electrical capacity specifications.

During emergency don't run but walk.

Know who to call first.

Shortly after the theoretical aspect of the exercise Mr. Ferdinand swung into action on practical note.

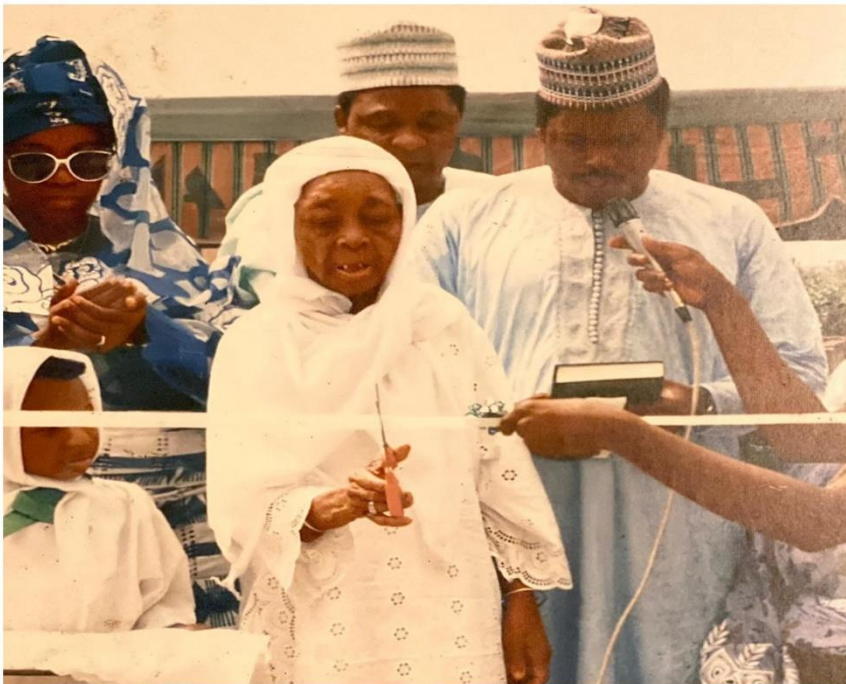
Sheikh Muhammad Mansur Al-Mansur Akinola Williams, a Crowned Prince of (Eko) Lagos, is born into the prestigious, illustrious and aristocratic Williams' family of Ita Kose-Olowogbowo area of Lagos Island in the mid 1950s.

He is the 12th child of Baba Prince Hamidu Akanbi-Aro (Ajoba madade) Williams, a double Prince from both Akinsemoyin and Ologun Kutere Royal Families of Lagos.

From his maternal side, Sheikh is the son of Olori Agba Kosenatu Iyajuya Williams (Borokini Adini of Aguda Central Mosque Aguda Surulere Lagos and the Alariya Adini of Nawairu-deen society of Nigeria among others), daughter of Alhaja Chief Sinatu Atupa Palour (First Iya Adini of Lagos central mosque and subsequently the Iya Adini of Nigeria), equally from the lineage of Eletu Odibo of Lagos, a family of noblemen who act as a prime minister of the Oba of Lagos and, historically served as the principal king maker.

Equally from Olorogun-ide chieftancy of Eko Lagos.

From all sides of these ROYALTIES, Sheikh is well raised.

Royalties are his identities and these, without iota of doubts, describe his person to be so blessed with great ingenious abilities in attending to issues before him with great comportments that commensurate the adulation of a king.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND SOJOURN INTO SECURITY WORLD

He attended nursery school at Kosoko's Palace, Ereko, Idumota, and had his primary school education at Ansarudeen Primary School, Alakoro, Lagos Island and he proceeded to Ahmadiyya College, now Anwarul- Islam College, Agege (all in Lagos State) for his secondary education.

With different motive, Sheikh personally enrolled himself into the Nigerian Customs Preventive Service and proceeded to police college Kaduna where he was trained as a police officer in 1974 and subsequently trained as Custom Officer at Customs Training School, Harvey Road, Yaba, Lagos contrary to the wishes of his family. He worked briefly with Customs before leaving the country in pursuance of his higher education in England where he majored in both Business Studies and Advanced Marketing.

During his National Youth Service Corps back in Nigeria, he was posted to the Ministry of Finance where he was later redeployed to Nigeria Customs Service due to his earlier record.

Expectedly, he was later retained in the Customs Service after undergoing the compulsory National Youth Service Corps (NYSC).

He served as an O.C. Station at area 1 Apapa command and O.C. Legal at Murtala Mohammed International Airport, Ikeja, among other duties that include Water/Land patrol, Bill of entry verification, Refund seat, O.C. Epe station etc, at a very young age and was known for his dedication, meticulousness, conscientiousness and admirable service years. He however, left the Nigeria Customs Service in protest against the "injustice" and "corruption" marred Customs. He later acquired more degrees in various fields. Receptant of numerous awards





in Islam and education, locally, nationally and internationally. He was once Vice President of the Royal Crown Club of Lagos.

Sheikh was also elected as the delegate of Oshodi-Isolo Local Government Area in Lagos State for district/national constitution conference in 1994.

FORMATION OF FIRST ISLAMIC ENGLISH EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION (FIEF) ACADEMY



Having gone through the tussle of "injustice" with the Nigeria Customs Service, he chooses a new path: growing into an Islamic scholar and this, he did to the dismay of those who knew him as a brilliant and very articulate officer. This opened another chapter of his life as an Islamic Jihadist through his Islamic Magazine called "Voice of Islam International (ISSN 0795-4522)" which was widely accepted outside the shores of Nigeria.

The magazine, "Voice of Islam", later birthed the First Islamic English Educational Foundation (FIEF) Academy, specifically to give voice to the Muslims children and to counter the norm of going to secular schools in the morning and Islam/Arabic schools (popularly called Ile Kewu) in the evening and to return the muslim children to the first class citizen where they belong. To address this worrisome problem, the Founder, Sheikh Prince Muhammad Mansur Al-Mansur Akinola Williams, commingled both the secular and Islamic education together to the Glory of Almighty Allah.

Surprisingly, as against the earliest intention of establishing FIEF, majority of earlier pupils/students were mostly Christians who were enrolled by the parents in their numbers. The earliest beneficiaries were only concerned with the aim of benefiting from high standard tutelage and guardianship teaching offered by FIEF in all aspects even the Islamic Education.

The First Islamic English Educational Foundation(FIEF) Academy, eventually became one of the first private schools to be approved by any Government in Nigeria in 1988 alongside the Nigerian Navy and Airforce Schools.

FIEF Academy is a missionary school founded on Islamic principles with sound secular

Education. FIEF Academy is a citadel of learning which impart knowledge on each of its student. FIEF is an acronym that stands for First Islamic English Educational Foundation Academy. FIEF Academy has been in existence since 1985, that is, about 30 years. FIEF as a village or an empire on her own right is a safe haven for all and sundry as the management purposely created an atmosphere of “home away from home” where all students are taught to strive for perfection in everything they do. FIEF has won several awards for providing their students with standard quality Education. The school provides her students with knowledge morally, spiritually, physically and academically.

THE EDUCATIONAL ASPECT OF FIEF ACADEMY

FIEF Academy is operating three curriculums, the British curriculums, Nigerian curriculum and the Saudi-Arabia curriculum. The school makes it a duty to teach its students with the three curricular. The school organizes extra curriculum activities like debate competition, quiz competition, book analysis, excursions, club activities, Qur'an recitation competition, inter-house sport flag-off, cross country race to build the students' reasoning.

The children's day that takes place in FIEF Academy always takes a different dimension. The students are normally given the privilege to act as the staffs. On their day, the staff are told to suspend any sense of responsibility for the students to take over. The student normally behaves like the teachers or staff they are acting as. The students not only act as

the staffs but also does the staffs responsibilities like writing lesson plans and lesson notes, teaching the students coordinating the assembly, etc. There are always refreshments like cake, drinks, foods, snacks, and so on. The students are allowed on that day to put on their house clothes and not school uniform. The students are to put on decent clothes on that day. Also, the African child's day normally takes a different way in FIEF Academy. The students normally put on their cultural attire and are educated about the history of Nigeria. The student also showcases their different culture. FIEF Academy thinks of the well-being of her students first.

The cross-country day in FIEF Academy is like another. On that day, the students would dress in sport wears. The event starts with the opening prayer, to the guidelines by the sport chairman. Once the school gate is opened, the students move out and start jogging. That day, the school management normally put a lot of efforts in place in order to make that day a success. The school management invites traffic wardens like LASTMA, FRSC, LNSC, VIGILANTES AND POLICE. This measure is put in place in order to keep the students from any form of danger. When the student gets to a certain place, the whistle will be blown for the student to run faster. The winners are always decorated with medals and Trophies. The students are always provided with refreshment and they later engage themselves in indoor activities like table tennis, scrabble, ayo, badminton and so on till salat time.

THE SPIRITUAL ASPECT OF FIEF ACADEMY

FIEF Academy is a school that takes religion seriously. Everyday, the student observed their 5 daily obligatory salat at the right time. The school makes it a must for every student to memorize the Qur'an. The student participates in the termly Qur'an competition and are tested on the surah they must have memorized.

Ramadhan in FIEF Academy is known as “the festival of food” because the students are given a lot to eat and drinks. Ramadhan is the 9th month in the



Islamic calendar. This is the month where Allah ordained fasting. All Muslims of the world and the students of FIEF Academy are not left out. Once the moon is sighted, fasting starts.

The night before the first of Ramadhan FIEF Academy along with her student starts the Taraweh prayer with the first JUZ of Al-Qur'an leg by the school Imams per night till the end of the last night of Ramadhan. FIEF academy normally endeavors to finish at least a whole Qur'an before the end of Ramadhan.

The next day, the student wake up 3:00am and have their bath. Then, they go to the mosque for tahajjud till 4:30am. After the tahajjud, the students go to the dining hall for their sahur. Pap and moimoi/akara is first served with milk to the student before their main meal. The students finish their meal and goes to the mosque for salat-ul-fajir.

During school hours, the student attend classes and receive lectures till solatu-z-zar. Once it is time for solatu-zuhr. The students listen to tafsir conducted by the school Imams. Once it is 12:00pm, the student resume lectures till solatul-zur. After observing solatu-asr, the students go to the hostel for siesta till 6:00pm. By 6:00pm, the student are in the dinning hall, reading their books and preparing to break their fast.

Iftar In FEIF Academy is where the festival starts from. Once the students break their fast. They are first served with fruits like, watermelon, cucumber, banana, etc. golden melon. Then pap, moi moi and akara is served before solatul-maghrib. After solatul-maghrib, the students go to the dining hall for the second round of their meal. After their main meal the students go to the mosque.

There are still so many things I have not written about FIEF Academy. FIEF Academy not only take care of their students but also takes care of their staff as well. FIEF Academy is known for enforcing discipline on its students.

I can go on and continue talking about FIEF Academy. I'm grateful to Allah for making me witness this great opportunity of attending FIEF Academy. I'm proud to be a FIEF student. FIEF Academy is a school like no other.

JOINING CONGREGATIONAL PRAYER

1. Joining a congregational prayer: It is always preferred to pray in congregation rather than praying alone. According to an Hadith, the reward of praying in a group is 27 times greater than the reward of praying alone. If a congregation has started it is recommended to join it, and if one has missed some of the rak'ahs, he should repay the rakah he missed after the group has finished.



2. A Rakah in congregational Prayer: A Rak'ah is a unit of prayer consisting of recitation, standing, bowing and prostrating. The Rak'ah in a congregational prayer is the same as individual prayer. However, a person is considered to have

gotten a Rak'ah if he is able to join it before the Imam rises from rukuh.

3. How to join congregation that has started: If he was able to join the Imam before the rising from rukuh, he should count that Rak'ah as his first. If, however, he was too late to join the imam in rising from Rukuh he cannot claim to have gotten the Rakah. He should still perform the rest of the Rakah with the Imam, but he should not count it as his first. It is the next Rakah that will be counted as his first.

4. How to join Salat al Fajr or Jum'ah Prayer: These two salat are two Rakah prayers. If a late comer did not get the first Rakah with the Imam, he should complete the prayer with him until he has completed the tashahhud. However, he should not join the Imam's "Teslim" instead he should rise and perform the Rakah he missed, reciting aloud then sit for tashahhud and say Teslim to terminate his prayer.

NOTE: A late comer for Friday congregation prayer who misses the rising from Rukuh in the last Rak'ah should perform four Rakah of Zuhur prayer.

5. How to join Maghrib Prayer: Maghrib is a three Rakah prayer. If the late comer misses only the first Rakah, he should follow the same procedure as for Salat al Fajr i.e. rising after the Imam has said his teslim then he should rise and perform the missed Rakah with Fatihah and a surah, completing with tashahhud and Teslim.

Taqwa may be translated as "GOD CONSCIOUSNESS" and is sometimes also translated as "piety" or "fear of God". Taqwa is shown in righteous actions.

QUR'ANIC DESCRIPTION OF THOSE WHO HAVE TAQWA

A full description of people who are "conscious of



God” and therefore righteous in conduct is given in the verses of the Qur’an below. These verses make it clear that Taqwa is not mere compliance with the outward forms of religion. Rather, taqwa comprises of sincere practice of the Pillars of Islam and moral firmness, including:

- Belief in Allah and the Day of Judgement, and in His Angels, Revelations and Prophets,
 - Free giving of Sadaqah to those in need (even of the things a person likes to keep for himself) as well as payment of the compulsory Zakat,
 - Constancy and regularity in prayer,
 - Keeping of promises and,
- Patience in times of misfortune, hardship and danger.

MEANING OF ATTAINING TAQWA

Qur’an 2:183 gives an indication that a person can improve his Taqwa by the faithful practice of any of the Islamic modes of worship including fasting, in addition to Qur’an 2:177. Fasting is a strict test of self-restraint and endurance. It is also an excellent exercise in Taqwa since the genuineness of a test can be known only to Allah and the person concerned.

IMPLICATIONS OF TAQWA FOR THE INDIVIDUAL, FAMILY AND SOCIETY

The possession of Taqwa must obviously improve the attitudes and behavior of the person who possesses it. He or she is firm in faith, generous and kind to family and relatives and to all those in need or distress, patient and enduring when hardship or danger comes. He has learned to overcome his selfish tendencies and to rely on God for his support and safety.

If every muslim will strive to practice his religion in full sincerity, there is no doubt that his Taqwa will increase. He becomes a better person, who will tend, under any circumstances, to take right moral choices. Thus, not only does he benefit himself in this world and the hereafter; he also benefits his family and the society where he lives and work. He does not need to be lectured, watched, policed or forced before he does good. It is the cultivation of Taqwa at individual level that ultimately produces a good society as a whole.

TAWHID: THE TWO DECLARATIONS OF FAITH

The teachings of Islam are based on five fundamental principles commonly called the five pillars of Islam. The division is based on the following well known tradition of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W) CALLED Hadith Jibril (Hadith 2 of An-Nawawi collection).

“While we were sitting with the messenger of Allah (S.A.W) a man came to us whose clothes were exceedingly white and his hair was very black. He has no visible signs of journeying and none of us knew him. He walked up and sat down in front of the Prophet, resting his knees against his and placing the palms of his hands on his thighs. He then, asked:” Islam is to testify that there is no god BUT Allah and Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah, to perform the formal prayers, to pay Zakat, to fast in Ramadan, and to make the pilgrimage to the house if you are able to do so”.

The first pillar of Islam consists of two declarations of faith (Shahadatan):

الله لا إله إلا الله محمد رسول الله

i.e., there is no god worthy of worship but Allah and that Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah (S.A.W).”

THE MEANING OF THE FIRST DECLARATION OF FAITH

The shahadatan has two sections, the first part, “There is no god but Allah”. However, from an Islamic perspective, it means that there is nothing truly deserving worship besides Allah. That is very necessary because in reality, there are many gods in this world.

Hindus have gods, Christians have gods, Buddhist have gods, in fact, everyone has gods. Thus, there are many gods worshiped besides Allah. That is,



though there are many different gods worshipped by human beings, none of these gods deserve that worship except the one true God (Allah).

CONDITIONS FOR THE FIRST DECLARATION OF FAITH

In order for the first declaration of faith in Allah to be considered valid, it should first be based on knowledge.

THE FIRST CONDITION: KNOWLEDGE

For the declaration of faith in Allah to be considered valid, it should first be based on knowledge. Allah (S.W.T) said in surah Muhammad,

...اعلم أنه لا إله إلا الله... ف

(Qur'an 47: verse 19)

The Prophet (S.A.W) also said,

“Whoever dies knowing that none has the right to be worshipped but Allah will enter paradise”. (Muslim, hadith No.39)

Mere parroting of the phrase “La illaha illallah” is not sufficient for one to really benefit from it. One who makes the Declaration of Faith is considered a Muslim even if he or she does not fully understand all of its implications.

However, it is essential that one declaring faith has basic knowledge of Allah in order to have correct belief in Him.

THE SECOND CONDITION: CERTAINTY

The second is that of certainty, meaning that the person declaring faith should not have any doubts in his or her mind about Allah being the One True God and that He does not share His power with human beings, etc. Allah (S.W.T) said in suratul Hujrat,

تَمَّا الْمُؤْمِنُونَ الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا بِاللَّهِ وَرَسُولِهِ إِنَّمَا

!!!!

(Qur'an 49: verse 15)

“Indeed, the believers are only those who believe in Allah and His Messenger, then do not have any wavering or doubt...”

The Prophet (S.A.W) was quoted as saying,

“Whoever bears witness that none has the right to

be worshipped but Allah and that I am THE MESSENGER OF Allah, and meets Allah having no doubt in this, then Allah will put him in paradise”. {Muslim, Vol.1, p.20, hadith No.41.} The reason why people do not complete their salat (Prayer) in a day is the presence of doubt in people's hearts about Allah. They are not sure whether He exists or not.

THE THIRD CONDITION: SINCERITY

Sincerity is a necessary condition for the validity of declaration of faith. Allah mentions in many places in the Qur'an that the religion of Islam which he prescribed is one which its rites and rituals are all done sincerely. Otherwise they are not accepted.

وَالَّذِينَ هُمْ عَنْ آلِهَتِهِمْ تَبَتُّوا وَالَّذِينَ هُمْ عَنْ آلِهَتِهِمْ تَبَتُّوا

[Qur'an 98: Verse 5]

“And they were not ordered except to worship Allah sincerely, making all religion for Him alone...”

The Prophet (S.A.W) said:

“The person who will be most pleased with my intercession is the one who says”, 'none has the right to be worshipped but Allah' Sincerely from his hearth”.

[Ibid, Vol.1, hadith No. 98]

This condition ensures that the declaration is not for ulterior motives, that it is not merely a ritual done to achieve some worldly goal. It shuns away show-off.

THE FOURTH CONDITION: TRUTHFULNESS

One must be truthful when declares the Shahadah otherwise it will be devoid of sincerity and will not be acceptable to Allah. Allah (S.W.T) said,

لَقَدْ صَدَّقَ اللَّهُ رَسُولَهُ فِي الْبَيِّنَاتِ وَإِنَّكَ لَمِنَ الْمُنذَرِينَ

[Qur'an 29: Verse 3]

“Indeed, I tested those who came before them. Allah will know who are truthful and who are liars”.

The Prophet (S.A.W.) Said,

“Whoever bears witness, truthfully from his



hearth, that none has the right to be worshipped except Allah and that Muhammad is His slave and Messenger, without fail, Allah will make the hell fire forbidden for him”.

The condition of truthfulness is related to sincerity. One may be truthful but not sincere. However, one cannot be sincere without being truthful. Sincerity is a product of commitment to the truth.

THE FIFTH CONDITION: LOVE

This condition is very important due to the fact that people do love another person or thing more than the way they love their Creator [Allah (S.W.T)]. It is the nature of humans that if someone does good things for them by giving them or helping them in something to love the person. Allah (S.W.T) has blessed humans in many ways than what they can possibly count. Allah (S.W.T) says,

يَذَلُّوْا لِنَاسٍ مِّنْ دُونِهِ يُخْلِئُوْنَ لَهُمُ الْمَوْتُ وَ مَاذَا يُحْيِيُوْنَ هُوَ كَذِبٌ وَالْوُجُوْهِ الْبَاطِلِ
تَوَّابٌ شَدِيْدٌ

[Qur'an 2:165]

“And there are some people who take partners besides Allah, whom they love as they love Allah (S.W.T). But the believers love Allah (S.W.T) more than any other thing...”

Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W) said:

“If a person has the following three qualities, he will taste the sweetness of faith: that Allah (S.W.T) and his messengers are more beloved to him than anything else...”

[Bukhari, Vol.1, hadith No.15]

THE SIXTH CONDITION: SUBMISSION

The natural consequence of true love is submission. Sincerity born of love will lead one who declares his or her belief in Allah (S.W.T) TO ACCEPT AND SUBMIT OR ACT ON DIVINE INSTRUCTIONS.

Allah (S.W.T) called to that submission as follows:

يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا اسْمِعُوا بَيْنَهُمْ لَوْ كَانُوا

[Qur'an 39:54]

“And return to your Lord [in repentance] and submit to Him...”.

When people love somebody, they are willing to do anything asked of them. Submission is an expression of the belief that there must be good reasons behind the divine commands. Submission must be for Allah (S.W.T) alone.

THE SEVENTH CONDITION: ACCEPTANCE

For the completion of submission, the additional condition of acceptance must also be fulfilled. That is, submission should not merely be: “Well, I will do it because Allah (S.W.T) has commanded it. But I really don't think I should”. Acceptance must also be there for submission to be sincere and not just a ritual.

THE EIGHTH CONDITION: DISBELIEF

One must disbelieve in all that is worshipped beside Allah as a condition for the acceptance of the declaration of faith. This form of disbelief is very essential for the first declaration to be completed.

Those are the people that don't fear Allah and don't believe in his oneness. Therefore, the friends of shaytan are those people that go astray that do all bad things and they aren't God fearing servants.

A MUSLIM AND HIS PARENTS

Treating Them with Kindness and Respect

One of the main distinguishing characteristics of the true Muslim is his respect and kind treatment to his parents, because to treat parents with kindness and respect is one of the greatest commandments of Islam, as is clearly confirmed in the Qur'an and sunnah. The Muslim who is truly following this commandment which is constant theme in the book of Allah and the sunnah of His prophet, must be characterized by his kind and respectful attitude towards his parents.

HE RECOGNIZES THEIR STATUS AND KNOWS HIS DUTIES TOWARDS THEM

Islam has raised the status of the parents to a level

that is unknown in any other religion, in that it has placed kindness and respect towards them on a level that is just one degree below belief in Allah and through worship of Him.

Allah revealed many aayat which reinforce the message that pleasing one's parents come second only to pleasing Him, and respecting them is counted as a human virtue that is just one step below belief in Him:

“serve Allah, and join not any partners with Him; and do good-to parents” (Qur'an 4:36)

So, the true Muslim is kind and more respectful toward his parents than any other person in the world.

The open-hearted Muslim finds frequent references in the Qur'an which increases his respect for his parents and encourage him to treat them kindly:

“And we have enjoined on man (to be good) to his parents: in travail upon did his mother bear him” (Qur'an 31:14)

Anyone who looks into the Islamic sources regarding the kind treatment of parents will also find plenty of hadeeth that reiterate the message of the aayaat quoted above and reiterate the virtue of kindness and respect towards one's parents, as well as warning against disobedience or mistreatment of them for any reason whatsoever. Abdullah ibn Mas'ood (R.A) said:

“I asked the prophet (saw), “which deed is most liked by Allah? He said, kindness and respect towards parents. I asked him, then what? He said, jihad for the sake of Allah.” (Bukhari and Muslim)

The prophet (S.A.W), who was a great educator, placed kindness and respect towards parents between two of the greatest deeds in Islam: prayer offered on time and jihad for the sake of Allah. Prayer is the pillar or foundation of the faith, and jihad is the pinnacle of Islam. What a high status the prophet (S.A.W) has given to parents: **HE IS KIND AND RESPECTFUL TOWARDS THEM EVEN IF THEY ARE NOT MUSLIM.**



The prophet (S.A.W) raised his teachings to a new peak when he advised his followers to treat their parents with kindness and respect even if they followed a religion other than Islam. This is clear from the hadith of Asma' Bint Abi Bakr As-Siddiq (R.A) who said:

"My mother came to me, and she was a Mushirk at the time of the Prophet and ask for my help, so, should I help her? He said yes, keep in touch with your mother and help her" (Bukhari and Muslim)

The true Muslim who understands the meaning of this Qur'anic guidance and the teaching of the prophet (S.A.W) cannot but be the best and kindest of all people towards his parents, at all times. This is the practice of the Sahaabah and those who followed them sincerely. A man asked Sa'eed ibn Al-Musayyab(R.A) "I understood all of the aayah about kindness and respect towards parents, apart from the phrase but address them in terms of honor?" Sa'eed replied: "It means that you should address them as a servant address his master." Ibn siren used to speak to his mother in a soft voice, like that of a sick person, out of respect for her.

HE IS EXTREMELY RELUCTANT TO DISOBEY THEM

If we turn from the commandment to treat parents with kindness and respect, and look at what Islam says to discourage disobedience towards one's parents, we find teachings that are aimed at making the disobedient child realize the error of his ways. Disobedience towards one's parent is likened to shirk (polytheism), whereas treating them with kindness and respect is connected to belief in Allah. Disobedience towards one's parent is a heinous crime that the true Muslim fears to commit, because it will diminish his reward and is, in fact, viewed as one of the worst sins.

Abu Bakrah Nufay' ibn Al-Haarith said:

"The messenger of Allah (saw) asked us three times, 'shall I tell you the grave sins? We said, 'yes, O messenger of Allah.' He said: associating partners with Allah and disobeying one's parents." (Bukhari and Muslim)

Allah (S.W.T) said in His Glorious Qur'an:

إِنَّمَا أَمْوَالُكُمْ وَأَوْلَادُكُمْ فِتْنَةٌ وَاللَّهُ عِنْدَهُ أَجْرٌ عَظِيمٌ

"Your wealth and your children are only a trial...."
[Surat-at-Taghabun 64:15]

This verse is simply telling us, that anything we are blessed with in this world is for us to use it to procure the best in the Hereafter. Many verses in the Qur'an explain the true meaning of success, among which is the saying of Allah (S.W.T):

أُولَئِكَ لَهُمْ نَصِيبٌ مِّمَّا كَسَبُوا وَاللَّهُ سَرِيعُ الْحِسَابِ
"... But of mankind there are some who say: "our Lord! Give us (your bounties) in this world!" and for such there will be no portion in the Hereafter.

And of them there are some who say: "our Lord! Give us in this world that which is good and in the hereafter that which is good, and save us from the torment of the fire!"

Those of them will be allotted a share for what they have earned. And Allah is swift in reckoning".

[Suratul Baqarah 2: 200 - 202]

From the verses above we are made to realize that this world and its bounties are temporal and worthless compare to the one in the hereafter, it also explain to man that he should not feel so happy for anything he is blessed with in this world such as being famous, rich, healthy, wealthy, etc. are instrument to acquire better and everlasting joy in the A'khira (Next World).

After a person accept Islam as the true and only faith to success, there are four things that must be in that person's personality. The first and foremost thing that must be in that person is the believe (in Islamic Monotheism) declaring Allah to be the only God worthy of worship in the Heaven and Earth. To complete this, he needs to believe in the following:

1. Allah
2. His Angels
3. Messenger
4. His revealed Books
5. The Day of Resurrection, and

6. Al-Qadar (Divine preordainments, i.e whatever Allah has ordained must come to pass.) And to act on the following principles of Islam:

1. To testify that none has the right to be worshipped but Allah and that Muhammad is the messenger of Allah)
2. To offer the (compulsory congregational) Prayer's dutifully and perfectly,
3. To pay Zakat
4. To perform Hajj (i.e pilgrimage to Makkah) and
5. To observe Saum (fast) during the month of Ramadan.

The second thing that needs to be in the person is doing righteous good deeds. Righteous deeds can be done in any form. The righteous good deeds here must be in line with the dictates of Allah and of the Prophet and practiced by the companions. Allah (S.W.T) said:

(سورة الأحزاب: (21)

"فَمَن كَانَ يَرْجُوا لِقَاءَ رَبِّهِ فَلْيَعْمَلْ عَمَلًا صَالِحًا..."
(سورة الكهف: ١١٠)

"...Indeed in the Messenger of Allah (Muhammad SAW) you have a good example to follow for him who hopes in (the Meeting with) Allah and the Last Day..." (Suratul Ahzab: 21)

"...So whoever hopes for the Meeting with his Lord, let him work righteousness..."

(Suratul Kahf: 110)

The above verses explain it clearly that if man wants to really be successful, he/she must do righteous good deeds according to the way it was done by the Prophet (S.A.W) and his companions. The third thing that must be in that person is that he enjoin on others truth and righteousness (i.e counsel one another to perform all kinds of good deeds which Allah (S.W.T) has ordained, and abstain from all kinds of sins and evil deeds which Allah has forbidden) He/she must always stand on the truth and call people to the truth. This according to Qur'an.

The fourth thing that must be in that person is he/she should recommend to others patience because sufferings, harms and injuries which one may encounter in Allah's cause, during preaching his religion of Islamic Monotheism or Jihad is for a while and shall be followed by ease "So verily, with the hardship, there is relief," (Qur'an 95 verse 5). In all sphere of life Patience is one of the most important things that helps man to maintain balance especially in the cause of Allah. Though it is so hard but with the zeal to please Allah it is practicable. Allah (S.W.T) so much emphasize on patience to the extent that He said in Qur'an

(سورة البقرة ٤٥)

"And seek help in patience and As-salat (the prayers) and truly, it is extremely heavy and hard except for Al-Khashi'un (i.e the true believers in Allah (S.W.T) those who obey Allah (S.W.T) with full submission, fear much from His punishment, and believe in his promise (paradise) and in His warnings (hell).

This He has commanded you that you may understand. "And come not near to the orphan's property, except to improve it, until he (or she) attains the age of full strength; and give full measure and full weight with justice. We burden not any person, but that which he can bear. And whenever you give your word (i.e. judge between men or give evidence, etc.), say the truth even if a near relative is concerned, and fulfill the Covenant of Allah, This He commands you that you may remember. "And verily, this (i.e. Allah's Commandments mentioned in the above two Verses 151 and 152) is my Straight Path, so follow it, and follow not (other) paths, for they will separate you away from His Path. This He has ordained for you that you may become Al-Muttaqun" (Suratul An'aam, Verse 151 – 153)

"And among those we created is a community which guides by truth and thereby establishes justice" (Quran 7:181)

Abu Hurairah reported that the messenger of Allah (S.A.W) said, "The strong man isn't the winning wrestler, but he is the one who controls himself when he is angry."

GENERAL MEANING

Most people imagine that the real strong individual is the one who is able to defeat all his opponents by physically overpowering them. Contest are held every year all around the world in wrestling, judo, karate, boxing and even arm wrestling to prove who is the most powerful, based on physical strength. The winners are named world champions or other similar titles, but this physical display of strength doesn't really show who the true strong individual is. In this hadith, the Prophet [S.A.W] tells us that the strongest man is the one who can control himself when he gets angry.

Perhaps one of the most common reactions of those who get angry is to slap the face of the one who caused them to be angry. However, this act has been prohibited in Islam. Abu Hurayrah quoted the Prophet (S.A.W) as saying:

"When one of you fights with his brother, he should avoid hitting his face".

Anger is perhaps the most dangerous and destructive emotion known to man because of that, the Prophet (S.A.W) also said: "Don't get angry", and "If you get angry, keep quiet". On another occasion he said that, "If you're angry

- E. Foresight: This means to look ahead on issues beyond what other people could immediately think of. The migration to Abyssinia was undertaken on the instructions of the Prophet (SAW) to ease tension in Makkah and to find some peace for some of the converts.
- F. Firmness: This connotes striking firmly to a known and accepted principle or idea. The prophet refused to wave out the punishment at theft and insisted on carrying out the punishment despite the plea of the clan of the thief. He even remarked or swore that such punishment should be metted out even if it is his beloved daughter, Fatima.
- G. Justice: The Prophet maintained a sense of justice and distribution of whatever he had the right to distribute. He similarly enjoined on Muslims to fear Allah and to be just.

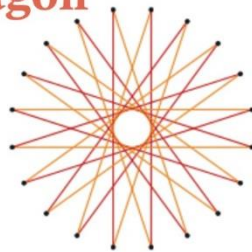

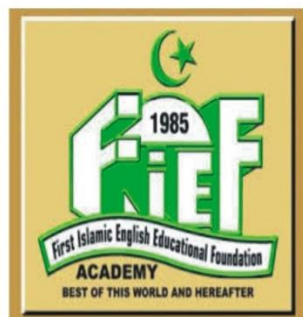

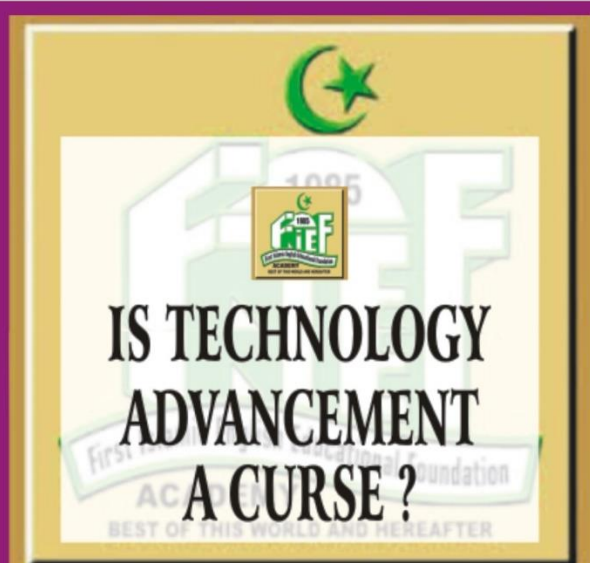
intellectual and serious minded students.

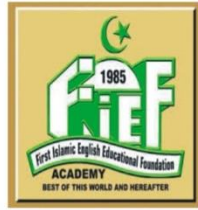

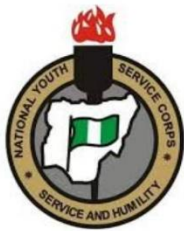
Every four years we tend to yearn for change in an

PHASING OUT THE NYSC: (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IS PLAYING WITH FIRE)

Having gone through the Nigerian civil war for about 30 months, the Nigerian government headed by General Yakubu Gowon on May 22, 1973, through decree No.24 established the Nigerian Youth service corps. It was created as an avenue for the reconciliation, reconstruction and rehabilitation of the nation after the civil war. It was established based on the decree that stated that the scheme was created “with a view to the proper encouragement and development of common ties among the youths of Nigeria and the promotion of national unity”.



The Pride of Nation

A move by the National Assembly, which has since passed the second reading, to phase out the NYSC, is nothing but a misplaced priority and disaster in waiting.

The reasons for this are not farfetched as the significance of the program NYSC outweighs its few shorts comings. In this respect, the following reasons would addressed why the NYSC must not be scrapped.

One major reason why the National Youths Service Corps should not be phased out is that the program helps in contributing to the “accelerated growth of the national economy”. This is possible since “corpors” as they are fondly called are posted to several sectors of the economy such as education, telecommunication, aviation etc. where they contribute their quotas to this great nation. However, a move to scrap this program is definitely a direction of national disaster in the waiting.

Another cogent reason why the NYSC should not be scrapped is that the compulsory program helps in inculcation of “Discipline in Nigerian youths by instilling in them a tradition of industry at work, and of patriotic and loyal service to Nigeria in any situation they may find themselves”. In this respect, however, the NYSC must not be scrapped for whatever reason.

Another major reason why the National youths Service Corps must not be phased out is that “The equitable distribution of members of the service corps and effective utilization of the skills in area of national needs. Our “Corpors” as Nigerians used to call them, learn new languages, for instance, a Yoruba citizen posted to Kano to serve for a year would be able to speak Hausa language a little e.g “Zho” which means “Come” and among others. They also learn culture of various ethnic nationalities where they have been posted to serve or offer their national quotas.

In conclusion, the national assembly must come to the realization that the National Youth Service Corps is a major program that unite the Nigerians through the compulsory service of her Nigerian graduates from both the private and public universities and polytechnics. Since no conscription law exist in Nigeria like in countries such as North and South Korea, Russia, Egypt, etc. However, I must submit here that the NYSC and its corps members must be made to undergo a one year or two years military service as a way of addressing the need of extra boots in the Nigerian Armed Forces and a probable reformation of the scheme.

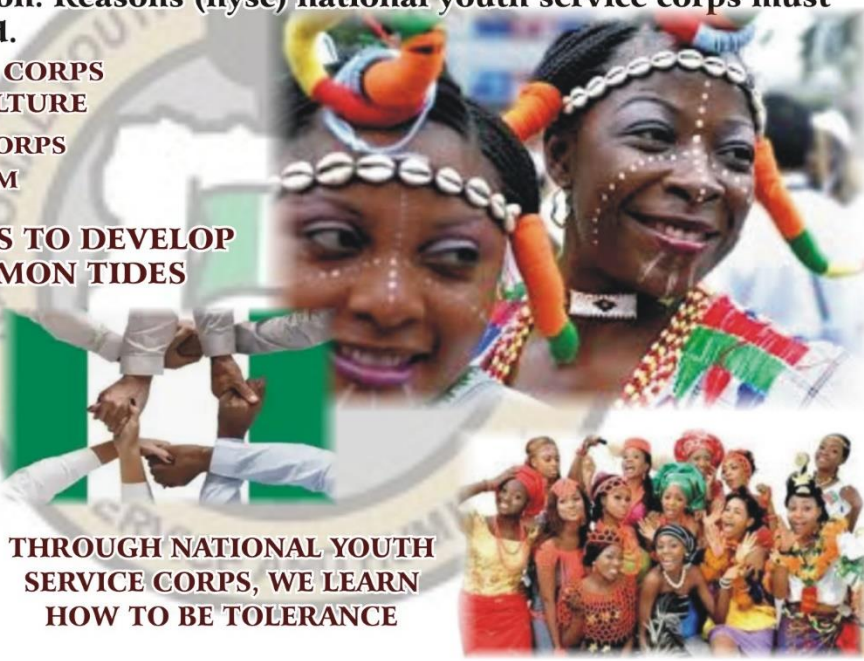

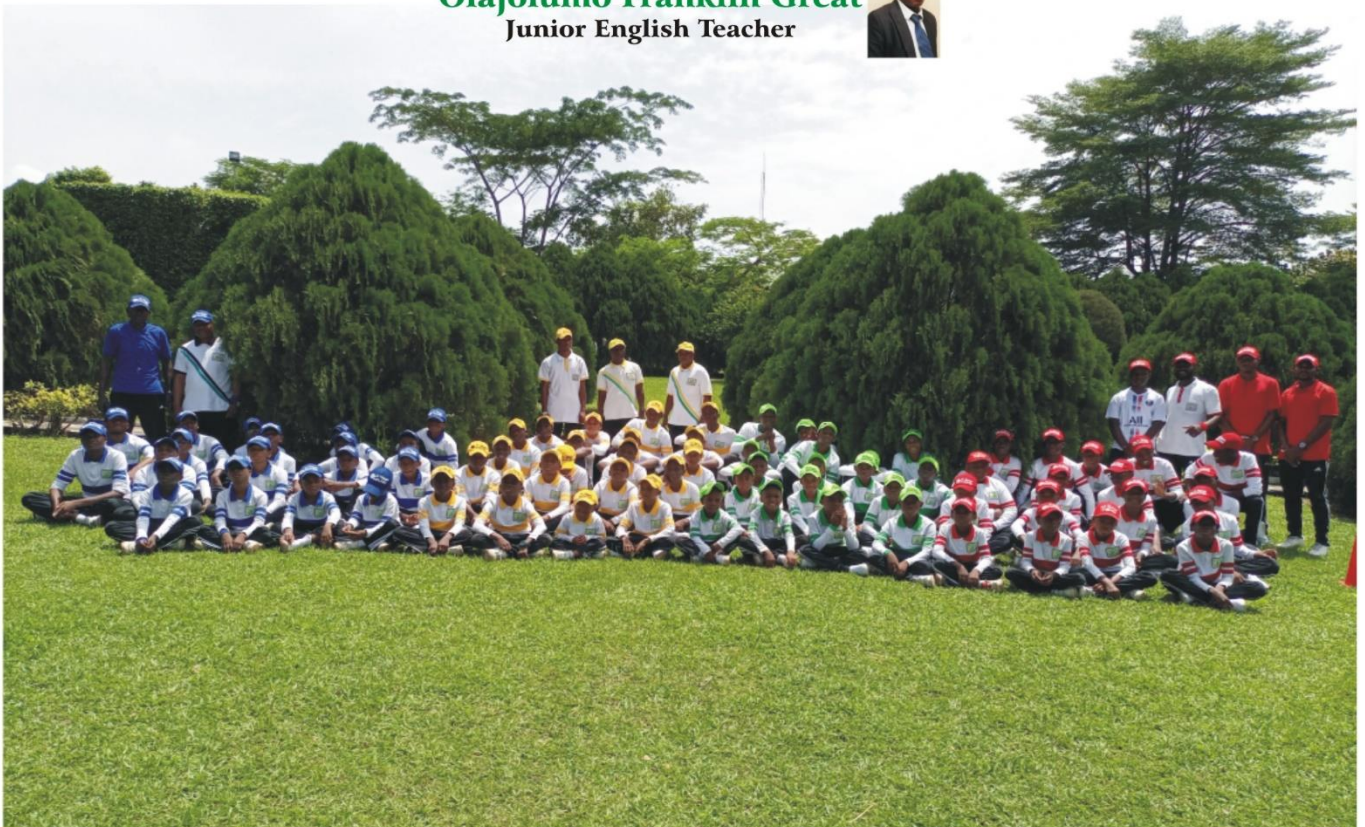

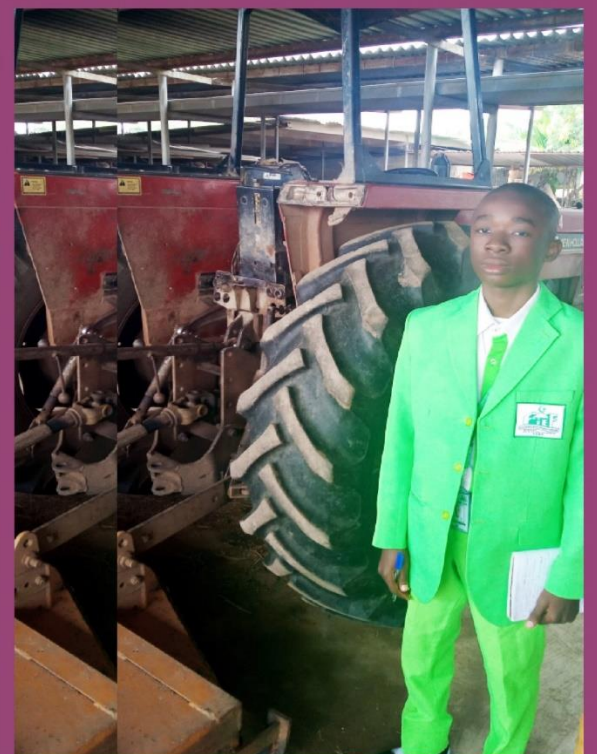

REPORT OF EXCURSION EMBARKED ON BY JETS AND CONSERVATION CLUB TO **EKO ATLANTIC CITY**

JETS AND CONSERVATION CLUBS make another landmark by visiting Eko Atlantic, Nigeria's new global city. 27 students (18 Boys and 9 Girls), 4 staff namely; Mrs. Mayeleke wafeeqah and Mrs. Maryam Williams (The school principal) graced the excursion. Eko Atlantic's story started in 2003 when Lagos state Government was in search of a permanent solution to protect Bar Beach off Victoria Island from the effect of severe coastal erosion and to safeguard Victoria Island from the threat of flooding. Between 2003 and 2005, a feasibility study was undertaken with international expert to solve the problem once and for all. Plans for a massive sea revetment enclosing a new city emerged to simultaneously protect the coastline and solve the chronic shortage of quality real estate in Lagos. The project is privately funded by South Energyx Nigeria Limited- the developers and city planners, a subsidiary of the Nigeria-based chagoury Group of companies- working in strategic partnership with the Lagos State Government and approved by the Nigerian Federal Government. Project uniqueness of Eko Atlantic state-of-art infrastructure and world-class design on reclaimed 10million square

meters land include Independent Power Supply, Independent Water Treatment, Advance telecommunication, Low Carbon Footprint, No – on street parking, International School and International Hospital, 8.5km Great Wall of Lagos with 18m depth height. The Eko Boulevard (8-cave arterial, 1500m long) is the major Gateway road to the city and heart of the Business District, the city's iconic centerpiece is now rising to provide average 350,000 jobs when completed.

There is a centralized water, sewage and storms for Eko Atlantic area. 14 bridges are conspicuously design for easy traffic network flows. All bridges employ a post-tensioning deck reinforcement.

The project is paving way for Nigeria to become a top 20 global economic power within the next decade.

The Great Wall of Lagos is being constructed to the highest standard of marine engineering available in the world today. An international team of highly skilled coastal and marine engineers applied physical scale model tests and computer simulations in Denmark to assess its stability under the pressure of extreme wave condition. The design splits into 12 different layers of rock and concrete which form this massive structure, 45m

wide and average depth of 18meters. The ultra-modern city architectural model was visited. The architectural and engineering designs video and processes was watched while questions were asked by Aisha Asimilowo (ss1), Adeniji Faruq (ss3) and Taofeek Salman (Js 1), the questions was centred on ecological and geographical effect of pushing the sea away through sand filling and also effect of salty sea water on the foundation of sky scraper building in future. We are directed to visit their website for more details about the project. Thereafter Miss

Ngozi Nwobodo (Tour Guide) led our team in a convoy to the construction site to see layout setting out and level of development of the on-going EkoAtlantic city project.

Pictures were taken at strategic points by Miss Asma Mansur-Williams. FIEF year books, flyers and souvenirs were given to Miss Nwodo on behalf of the company. Refreshment was served in the bus. We returned to school around 12:30pm. In all the excursion was classic and interesting. We thank the management for given us the opportunity to embark on the excursion.

JETS CLUB EXCURSION REPORT TO ME CURE HEALTH CARE LIMITED, APAPA-OSHODI EXPRESSWAY

On 19th June 2019, the above-named club embarked on an excursion to a State-of-the-art diagnostic health centre called 'Me Cure' Healthcare Limited. Thirteen students and two coordinators participated in the trip. We left the school premises at about 9:05 AM and got to the venue at 10:05 AM after the due screening, accreditation and prayer from the school. Mrs. Balogun Gbemi who is a receptionist welcomed the students and coordinators at the reception. She later introduced us to the head of the Biochemistry Department (Mr. Badru Taofeeq). He showed us some of the pieces of equipment used in the laboratory such as Unicel Dx 1800 used to determine the cholesterol and blood sugar level of a patient. He also told us that they conduct immune chemistry tests like cancer antigens, tumour markers pathology, she showed us some of the tests they carry out like CT-scan for hard tissues like bones, Mammography diagnosed and scan that check the breast of a woman in case of any lumps or breast cancer and women under 4 years do not take the test. Also, we visited another machine called Histopathology scan which is used to scan any part of the body that has undergone surgery to check if it is cancerous. Mr. Patrick in charge of the MRI(Magnetic Resonance imaging) department explains how they scan soft tissue and if you are going for this test you should not wear any metallic materials, otherwise, the person will be magnetized to the machine. From there we went to the video conference auditorium, where they conduct their meetings and other functions.

He took us to the VIP lounge where they do spa, beauty and wellness. The students also saw series of cubicles of electronic massage chairs in the VIP lounge. Then we proceeded to HMO(Health management organization), which is preserved for heads of companies, C.E.O's, directors etc, who received fast treatment without any delay. She then showed us a CT-Scan image of a brain and an X-ray film of a pelvic girdle. Other sections visited were Cytol/Histopathology, molecular biology, phlebotomy room. Another interesting section visited was the X-ray section with both digital and analogue x-ray machines. We were shown the report reconciliation room where images scanned would be printed and also introduced was a Radiologist whose work is to analyze all scan images.

The students went to the Spa section, where some students had their legs massaged. They told us the leg has a connection with the brain and most of the body coordination is at the foot. After the massage, the students,

staff and some top Me-cure officials moved to the video conference auditorium for presentation and photograph. FIEF yearbook, magazines, and flyers were presented to the Chief medical director by Adeniji Farouk (SS2). The students were very excited and cheerfully participated in all tour sections After, the group photograph, the students returned to the school bus for refreshment. Me-cure management

gave the students some gifts. The bus left the venue at about 12:32 pm and arrived at the school at about 112:50 pm The club uses this medium to thank the school management for allowing the students and staff to embark on this excursion.

In conclusion, the visit was amazing, enlightening and educative.

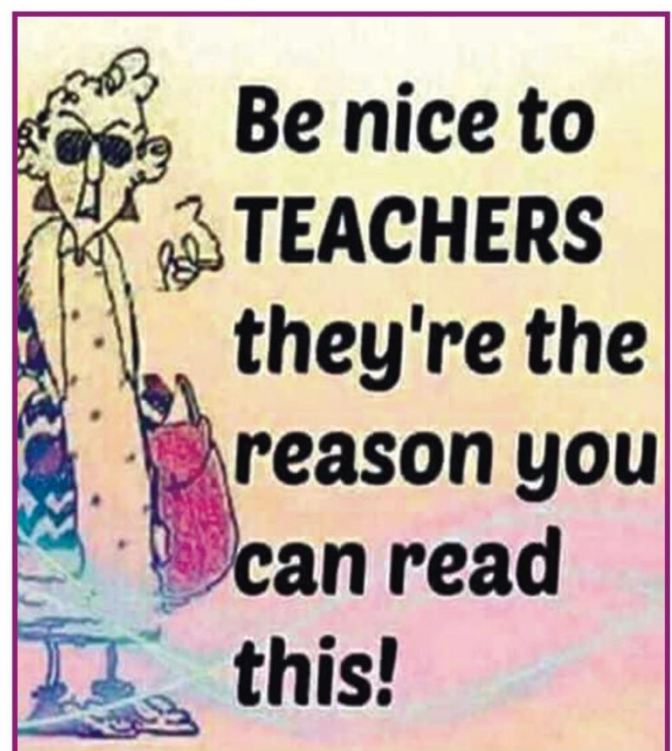

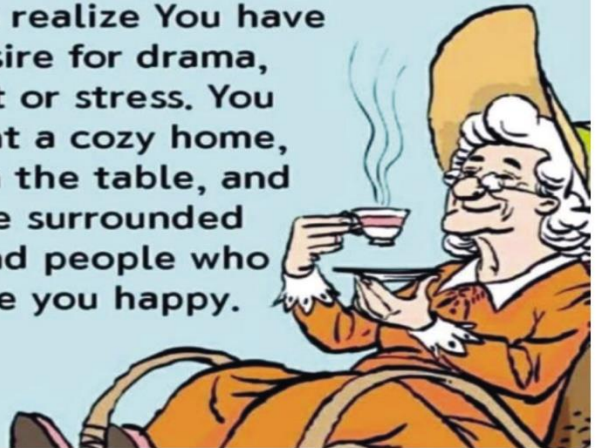

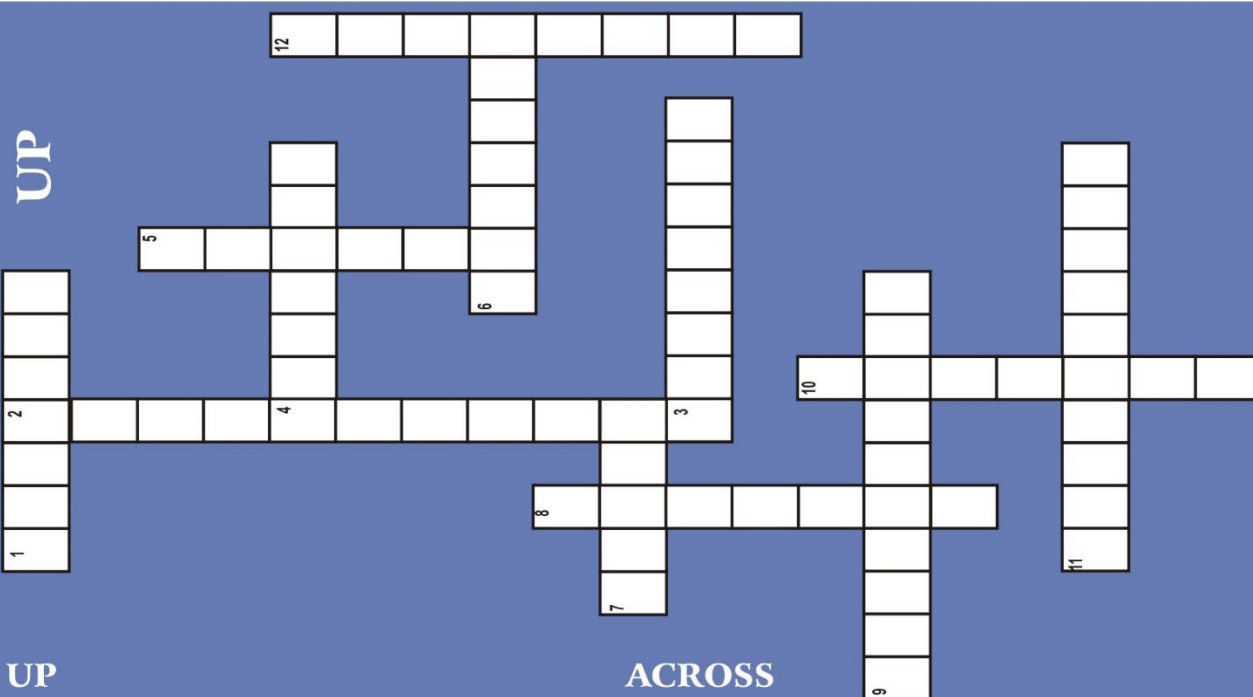

EDE'S EARLY HISTORY

Like other Yorùbá Kingdom and States, the early history of Ede is contained in numerous Yorùbá traditions, myths and legends, which are sometimes contradictory.

The most popularly, and generally accepted tradition states that Ede was founded during the reign of an early Aláàfin or ruler of the old Òyó Empire, in the fifteenth or sixteenth century C.E. A detailed version of Ede's foundation is presented in Samuel Johnson's "The History of the Yorubas", but this chapter offers a slightly different version generally believed to be true in Ede. Several local authors assert that Ede was founded by an Òyó military general named Agbale Olófà Iná, who had been given a military mandate to curb the excesses of marauders from the nearby Ìjèsà Kingdom and to safeguard the territories of the settlements of Awo, Ara and Ojo in the Òyó borderlands. After Agbale had left Òyó-Ilé, the capital he established his military base at a site called Ìdí-Ede located not far from the present-day location of Ede but on the northern bank of the river Osun. This site was so named because it contained many 'Ede' trees, and the town has retained to these trees in its name.

Within a short period of time, Agbale succeeded in establishing control over Idi-Ede and its environs. Agbale's leadership attracted traders and settlers to Idi-Ede, and as the military settlement expanded, it was renamed Ede-Ile or Ede town. Agbale also collected a toll of five cowries per head from the traders who passed through Ede-Ile. A portion of the collected tolls was meant to be sent to the royal treasury at Òyó as a proof of Loyalty and vassalage, but as Ede-Ilé began to expand, Agbale endeavor to assert the independence of his town and stopped the payment of tributes to the Aláàfin. The ensuing disagreement between the Aláàfin and Agbale Olófà Iná eventually led to the death of both men. In Ede, it is believed that the Aláàfin who died in this manner was Aláàfin Sàngó, who was later deified. After Agbale's death, the Ìjèsà resumed their attacks and eventually Aláàfin Kon, the successor of Aláàfin Sàngó, sent another Òyó warrior called AlapoTiemiTiemi to pacify the area. AlapoTiemiTiemi finally put an end to Ìjèsà incursions into this part of Òyó and established the title of the Ede rulers, who are called Timi after him this day.

Thus, Ede grew out of the desire of the Oyo Empire to protect its southern boundary. As an important border

town Ede also featured prominently in the struggles that followed the destruction of old Òyó in the war with Ilorin and the Sokoto Empire.

Infact, Ede was one of very few Òyó towns that maintained political independence from Ilorin during that period, and it participated actively in both the battle of Osogbo, during which Ilorin was defeated, and in the peace-making process that re-ordered the politics of the Yorùbá speaking area at the end of the nineteenth century. By the beginning of colonial rule Ede has maintained and strengthened its position as an important Òyó town in central Yoruba land, with significant military and political influence within and beyond the region.

For most of its history as a frontier town of Òyó, Ede's most important deity (orisa) is said to have been Ogun, who was the main diety of the time. Widely worshipped throughout Yorùbá land, Ogun was associated with iron, war and metal works.

However, worship of Ògún was by no means exclusive. In Yoruba cosmology Ogun is a powerful, fearless and brave warrior who possesses the power of conquest and victory. He is said to have been one of the first of the Òrìṣà, or dieties, to descend to the realm of ilé aiyé (the earth) to find suitable habitation for future human life. This explains why one of his praise names is OsinImole, i.e the first of the orisa to descend from heaven to earth. He is the Yorùbá diety of iron. As the diety of iron, technology and conquest, Ògún was widely worshipped throughout Yorùbá land (before the arrival of Islam and Christianity). The reason for his pre-eminence in Ede was probably due to the fact that Ede was a frontier town where hunting, warfare and the provision of justice played an important role.

In Ede, Ogun's association with hunting is illustrated by the fact that the head of the ogun worshippers was called Olú Ọḍẹ, i.e the head of the



hunters.

The major items used in daily or weekly Ogun worship or sacrifice included cooked beans, kolanut and roasted yam.

During the annual Ògún worship in the seventh month of every year, a dog had to be slaughtered at the ogun shrine. The importance of Ogun is still attested today by the names of several traditional compounds in Ede. They include not only Ologun compound (the compound of ogun devotees) but also Olode Ibadehin, Olode Afenle and Olode Olokútá (compound of hunters) and Alagbede (a compound of blacksmiths). It should be noted that some other compounds have changed their embrace of a new religion, particularly Islam. However, even today ogun is worshipped in Ede by professionals such as hunters, blacksmiths, drivers, goldsmiths and other artisans who make use of iron and other metals.

Other important deities and masquerades in Ede included Sàngó, Òbatálá, Ipedi, Ajagemo, Egúngún, Òsun and Oya. Infact, there is hardly any form of Yorùbá traditional worship that did (and does) not have adherents in Ede town. The Egúngún (masquerade) in particular remains popular today. It is believed that people's ancestors reincarnate through the Egúngún masquerade, and this explains why they speak in an unnatural guttural tone.

Egungun worship is usually accompanied by festivities that include singing and dancing with masquerades parading the market centres in colourful costumes, and it is known to most town people through an annual festival. The annual Egungun festival is held for seven consecutive days in April, when masquerades of various statures come out to perform and pray for the people. It climaxes with the appearance of Oridoru, the most powerful and masquerade which is a s Oba or the masquerade important des in Ede Alupe, the dog was

lengthwise by two people while the third person cut it into two in one stroke. Failure to achieve this was considered an unacceptable sacrifice. The dog's blood was poured on Ogun's shrine. L. More than a hundred people were killed in the protests of the following two weeks, and more than a thousand were injured.

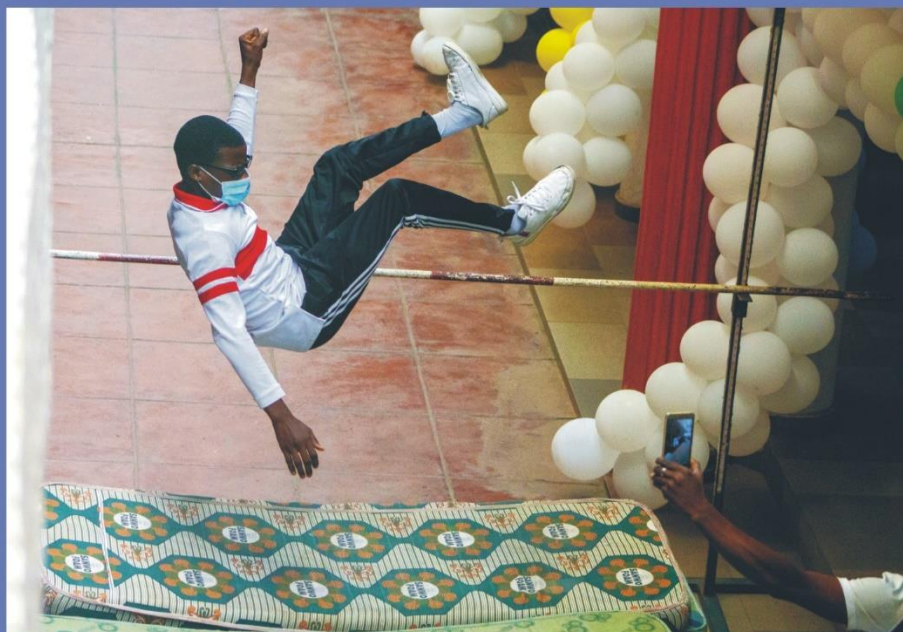

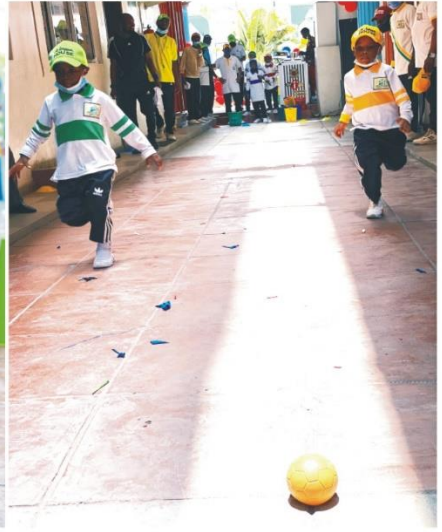

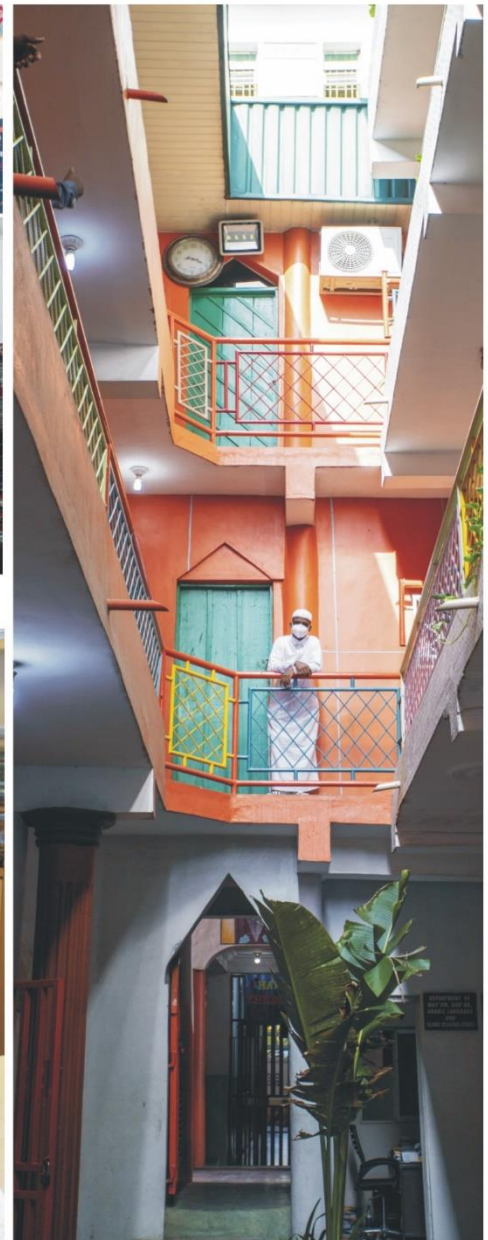

Evolving Earth

It is known and proven fact that “OUR HOME”, Earth is the third rock from the sun and the only world known to support life. This is because of an atmosphere with free oxygen and the oceans of liquid water on the surface.

Out of all the existing planets; four are referred to as the “TERRESTRIAL PLANET” i.e they are rocky at the surface. These four planets are Mercury, Venus, Mars and of course our global village the Earth.

Hmmm, as you are now! You may feel like you're standing still, but you're actually moving fast. Interestingly, you could be spinning through space at over 1,000 miles per hour. People on the EQUATOR move the fastest, while the people on the NORTH or SOUTH POLE would be perfectly still.

Do you know that research shows that our Earth is extremely older than you could imagine. Researchers calculated the age of the Earth by dating the oldest rocks on the planet. The oldest rock they've discovered is the basis for scientists estimate for Earth's age which is about 4.54 billion years old.

At first, Earth was molten and lacked an atmosphere and oceans. Gradually, it cooled and formed a solid crust. As the planet continued to cool, volcanoes released gases which eventually formed an atmosphere. The early atmosphere contained ammonia, methane, water vapor and carbon dioxide but a trace of oxygen.

As the atmosphere became denser, clouds formed and rain fell. Water from rain struck the earth and eventually formed the oceans.

After Earth first formed about 4.54 billion years ago, it was covered with river of molten rock instead of river of water. If you ask me; life as we know could not have survived in such a place.

HOW THE FIERY HOT PLANET become today's Earth that we can now live. One of the most important aspects of the planet's evolution is the formation of the atmosphere, because it is the assemblage of the gases that allowed life to crawl out of the oceans and to be sustained.



Life begins from the ocean

As we have said, the early atmosphere contained almost no oxygen.

One of the first set of surviving “Living Organisms” on the early Earth was the algae in the oceans and this is where production of oxygen into the atmosphere begins (by the algae).



Algae in Water

After a lot of oxidation has taken place (i.e. most of the minerals in the sea were oxidized) then, a lot of oxygen was accumulated in the atmosphere which research shows was about 2 billion years ago.

Conclusively, research shows that between one billion and two billion years ago oxygen reached current levels, creating a niche for life.



Healthy Earth

Today, the Earth's continents, oceans and the life they harbor which were perfectly shaped for us by the tectonic processes are now been threatened by human activities.



Degrading Earth

Human activity is now a dominant force which is affecting our Earth globally, harming the biosphere, the Earth's surface, hydrosphere and atmosphere with the loss of wild lands, over-exploitation of the oceans, production of greenhouse gases, degradation of the ozone layer and general degradation of the soil, air and water quality.

- The club has also recently visited the federal Institute of industrial Research, Oshodi, Lagos State. The students were exposed to lots of workshop training such as Cassava Flour Production, Pounded yam Flour production, Fufu Flour

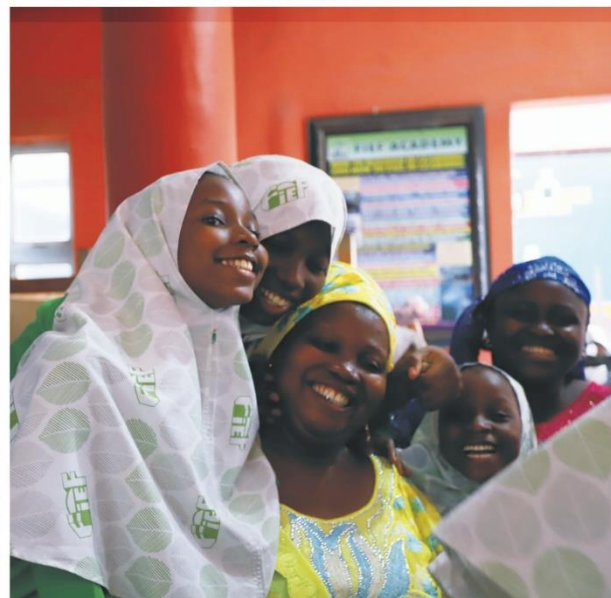

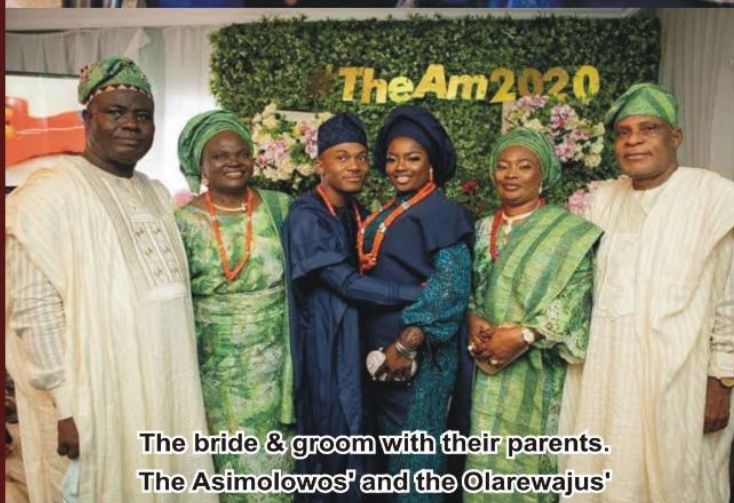

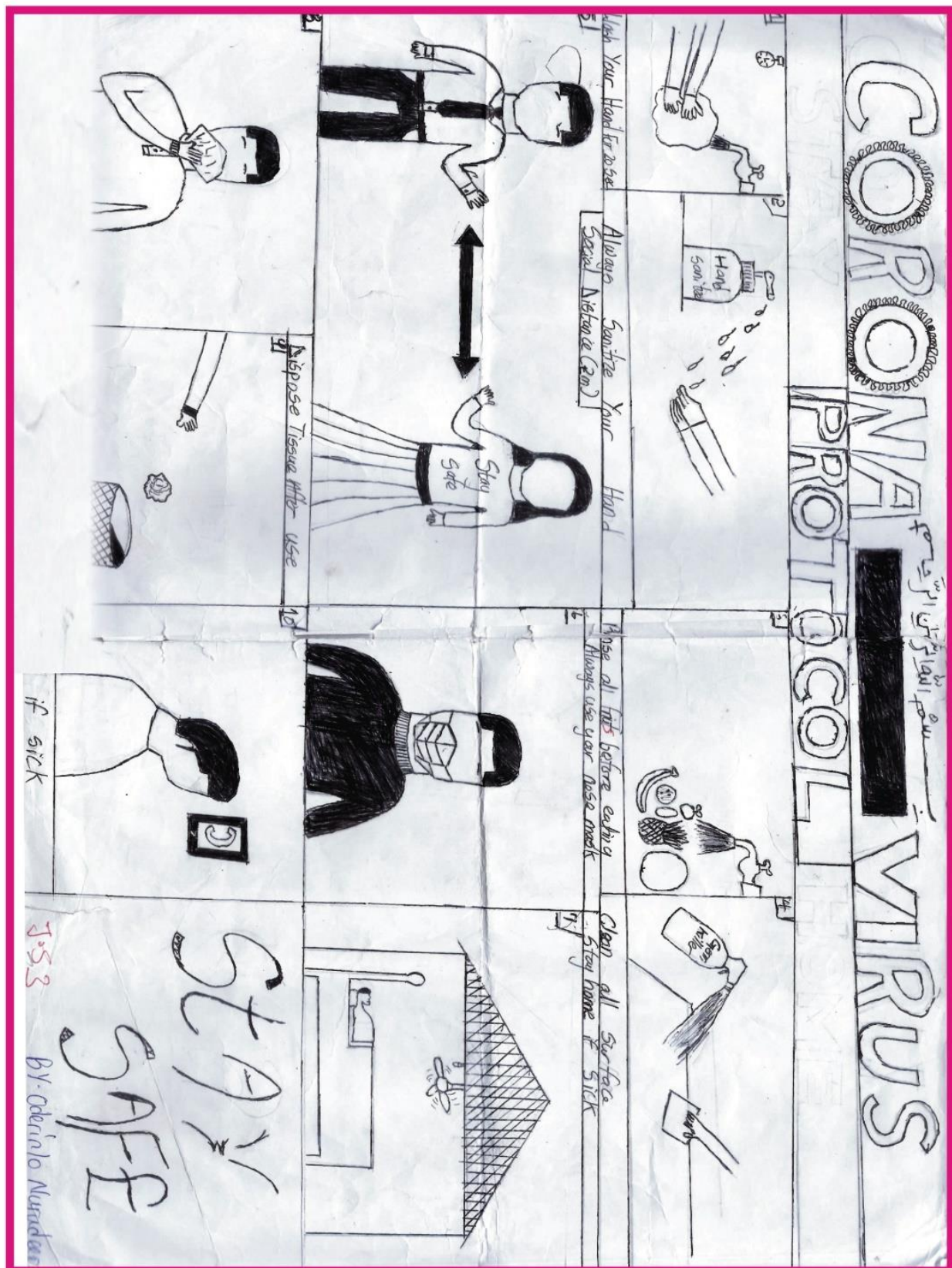
